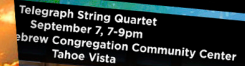

FROM OUR PRESIDENT

We are pleased to share this report of Tahoe Music Alive’s vibrant growth with you. This fall we are completing our third series of concerts—a wonderful success for a nonprofit organization established just two years ago.



CONCERTS AND COMMUNITY. Thanks to our donors, patrons, sponsors, staff, and volunteers, we have held 14 concerts and 11 music education outreach events, donated instruments for student use, and held regular free community events in the greater North Tahoe area. This year was not without its challenges, which included juggling concert venues, transporting grand pianos up the mountain, and adapting ticket prices to changing economic factors. Nevertheless, across the initiatives of our Strategic Plan, we are establishing Tahoe Music Alive as the premier regional provider of superb classical chamber music and jazz concerts in intimate settings.

A GROUP EFFORT. We are grateful to our world-class musicians who have made all this possible, and we are especially grateful to Friends of Tahoe Music Alive, concert sponsors, and volunteers whose generosity of time and spirit has contributed to our consistent, “excellent” attendee ratings. We are grateful for the growing number of individuals whose gifts

confirm the value TMA brings to them and the community. We appreciate the support of concert underwriters and the local organizations, whose grants have allowed TMA to take critical steps in program expansion and equipment acquisition.

By bringing world-class musicians into intimate, community-centered venues, Tahoe Music Alive enriches daily life, inspires local youth, and bolsters the regional economy. Each concert affirms that music is more than an art form; it is a vital force for Tahoe’s cultural vitality, community connection, youth development, and sustainable tourism. We are enabling the spread of great expectations.

With growing recognition from Reno, the Bay Area, as well as from prestigious national music competitions, Tahoe Music Alive is at an inflection point for establishing its success as a nonprofit organization that consistently delivers world-class classical and jazz concerts. 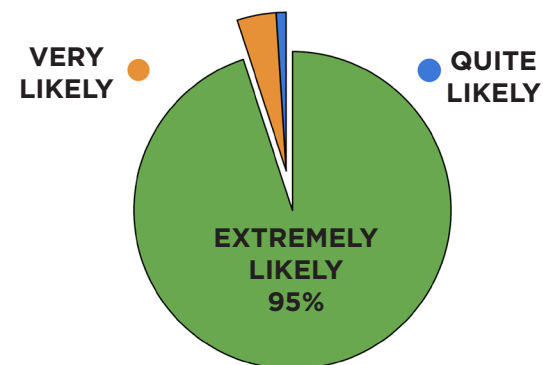

At each concert we ask audience members to fill out a brief questionnaire, asking about their reaction to what they have just heard. We use their responses to help guide future programs. As the graph at left shows, attendees overwhelmingly attest to the quality of our concerts, and quality is driving our success.

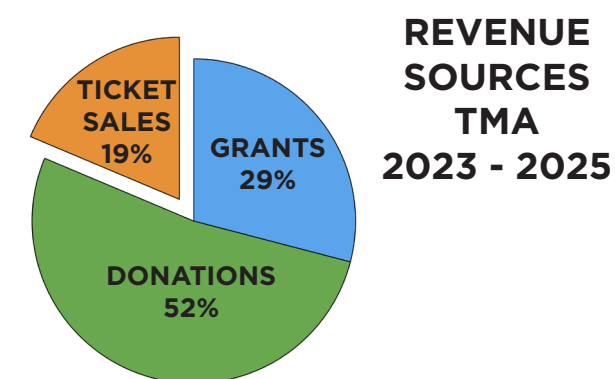

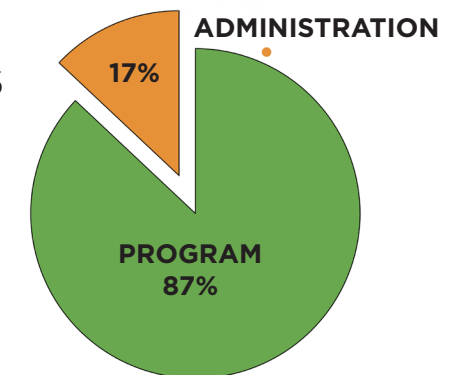

BUILDING A SUSTAINABLE ORGANIZATION

2023 - 2025

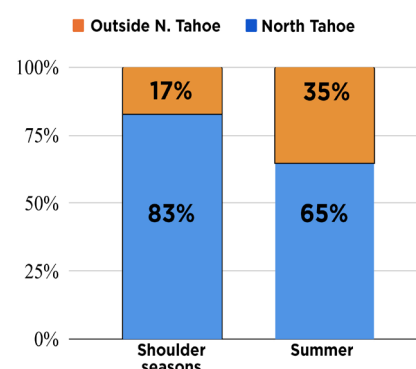
