

TELLING STORIES WITH MUSIC



Music tells stories by **shaping time and sound into emotion and motion.**

Lyrics can provide a direct storyline. But even without words, music can elicit a feeling, inviting listeners to imagine the details. With the motional arc of a melody, the context of harmony, the pacing of rhythm music can take the audience on a storytelling journey.

The music accompaniment to the trailer of ONI, "Onari's Lullaby," composed by Haruka Fujii, provided a multimedia finale to the [September 13th concert](#) at North Tahoe High School for an audience of over 120 people from across the Tahoe Basin, Reno, the Bay Area, and beyond.

At its core, the animated video of ONI is a story intentionally crafted for every generation. It tells the [Thunder God's Tale](#), an authentic Japanese story that inspires people to reject the fear of the unknown and encourages individuals to embrace their own unique identities.

ENERGIZING EMERGING MUSICIANS



It's well known that curiosity is a vital ingredient for learning.

The educational outreach and community engagement programs of Tahoe Music Alive allow personal engagement with the world-class musicians who perform in Tahoe Music Alive's concerts. Now in our second year of this community service complement to our concerts, we're committed to continuing this component of our programs.

Here are a few questions from middle/high school students in school outreach events:

When did you decide to become a musician?

What did you study in school?

Did you start on the same instrument you play now?

How much time do you spend practicing?

Here are some questions from community members at free "Musical Dialogues" events:

Which musicians or ensembles have had the greatest impact on your career?

How did you meet, and what influenced your decision to become an ensemble?

What qualities in each other do you admire best when you're making music together?

How much time do you spend traveling, and how do you balance that with home life?
