Jazz in the Mountains, August 17
Two Legendary Pianists
Two Grand Pianos
One Legendary Location



One of the finest and most empathetic piano duos in jazz history.

Grammy-award-winning jazz pianist, Bill Charlap and Downbeat-celebrated Renee Rosnes will perform a sparkling set of four-hand piano duets - on two grand pianos. They bring to this concert remarkable personal stories and an uncommon connection in music, as well as in life.

Over her storied career Renee has established a reputation of the highest regard, touring and recording with such masters as Joe Henderson, Wayne Shorter, Bobby Hutcherson, JJ Johnson, Buster Williams and James Moody. She was the pianist for the Carnegie Hall Jazz Orchestra and a founding member of the all-star ensemble, the SFJAZZ Collective, with whom she toured and recorded for six years. She is also a 14-year member of NEA Jazz Master Ron Carter's Foursight Quartet and plays with the award-winning all-female Artemis jazz ensemble.

Bill grew up surrounded by music, influenced by his father, Moose Charlap, the composer for Peter Pan and his mother, Sandy Stewart, who toured with Benny Goodman and sang on the Grammy winning album, "My coloring book." No surprise that his love for the piano put him early on into collaborations with many of the leading artists of our time including: Wynton Marsalis, Dee Dee Bridgewater, Ron Carter, Phil Woods, Gerry Mulligan and Tony Bennett.

Renee Rosnes describes the uniqueness of two piano jazz duo:

"It's finding a way to have a dance together where the whole becomes greater than its parts. In short, it's all about listening and supporting the music in real time. We orchestrate together, which basically means that we're just looking to make the overall sound, the orchestra of the two pianos speak to the audience, fulfill the melody and the harmony and the rhythm, and just make the flower blossom as we're playing. So, it's not different than having an actual verbal conversation with somebody."

Tahoe Music Alive has a deep commitment to community outreach. We ask each performing musician or ensemble to engage with the Tahoe community to expand the reach of our world-class musicians beyond the concert hall and directly into the schools and community spaces of North Lake Tahoe, in school visits and/or community master classes, to support education and youth development:

Education

TMA's youth outreach addresses an urgent need in North Tahoe schools, where music education is often underfunded and exposure to professional musicians is rare. Through partnerships with local schools and educators, TMA brings inspiring, curriculum-integrated programming directly into classrooms. These engagements deepen musical literacy, develop core academic skills, and support STEAM learning objectives.

Youth Development

Musical interaction builds confidence, discipline, communication skills, and resilience. For students in an era marked by social isolation and uncertainty, these experiences can be transformative. Positive connections with peers and enhanced mental well-being flow from the experience of playing music together. Exposure to high-level artistry models excellence and provides real-life pathways toward creative careers.

- Inspire youth appreciation and creativity.
- Demonstrate how music can be a pleasure, a passion or a career.
- Promote mental well-being and positive social connection.
- Support academic and STEAM development through musical learning.
