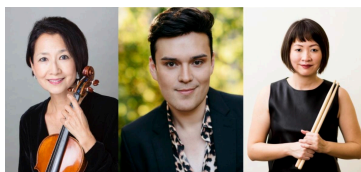

Tahoe Music Alive's programs continue to grow the perception of North Tahoe as an environmentally-rich cultural destination. Our programs and events build community cohesion and contribute substantially to regional identity, education, and youth development priorities. Each of Tahoe Music Alive's events supports our priorities, which are aligned with community development:

Community Cohesion

Tahoe Music Alive has a deep commitment to community building and provides a unique cultural offering for the region. It is well known that music supports mental well-being and positive social connection. All events include opportunities for social interaction as well as exceptional listening experiences.

Education

TMA's youth outreach addresses an urgent need in North Tahoe schools, where exposure to professional musicians is rare and music education is often underfunded. Through partnerships with local schools and educators, TMA brings inspiring, curriculum-integrated programming directly into classrooms. These engagements support music educators and instructors in their work to deepen musical literacy, develop core academic skills, and are designed to support academic and STEAM development through musical learning.

Youth Development

Musical engagement builds confidence, discipline, communication skills, and resilience. For students coming out of an era marked by social isolation and uncertainty, musical experiences inspire youth appreciation and creativity and can be transformative. Positive connections with peers and enhanced mental well-being flow from experiences of enjoying and playing music together. Exposure to high-level artistry provides models of excellence, as well as real-life pathways toward creative careers, which may include music as a pleasure, a passion or a career.

"SPELLBOUND" RECAP: CHARLAP & ROSNES



Two Pianos in Jazz Conversations About Love

On August 17, 2025, Bill Charlap and Renee Rosnes played a 90-minute set in a sold-out Tahoe Music Alive concert at Granlibakken Resort. Appropriately, they focused on songs about love, including "Just in Time," "My Funny Valentine," "Spring Is Here," "Never Will I Marry," "The Last Time I Saw Paris," "In Your Own Sweet Way," and Renee's "Spellbound." Their encore closed the performance with Duke Ellington's classic, "In A Sentimental Mood." The two-piano musical conversations left the audience spellbound indeed.

"Spellbound" was premiered earlier this year at 92NY's 2025 Gala, where Grammy winner Bill Charlap was celebrated for his 18 years as Artistic Director of New York City's Jazz in July Festival. Before he received the honor, his wife, internationally celebrated pianist Renee Rosnes, came forward to perform the world premiere of a piece that 92NY had commissioned her to compose as a surprise for him.

"Spellbound" was not only inspired by the magic of Bill Charlap's exquisite playing but also made reference to his childhood hobby as a magician. "Bill's playing always leaves me spellbound," said Renee, before the two of them played a sold-out duo concert at Granlibakken Resort.
